Re: Free-lance Reporting

Administrative Order No. 19




The application of Section 5.13 of the Kansas Court Personnel Rules to free-lance reporting by incumbent official court reporters is temporarily suspended upon the following conditions:

- (1) The incumbent reporter has not attained Step D or has not become eligible to attain Step D on the pay grade assigned to such reporter.
- (2) Approval of the supervising judge is obtained.
- (3) Approval of the administrative judge is obtained.
- (4) Any free-lance activity does not interfere with regular duties of the official reporter or cause any delay in the preparation of transcripts.
- (5) Except when engaged in authorized free-lance work, such incumbent reporter observes regular office hours as prescribed by the Kansas Court Personnel Rules.

This temporary suspension of K.C.P.R. Section 5.13 shall apply only to official court reporters currently employed within the Kansas court system. Court reporters employed after the effective date of this order shall not engage in free-lance activity during regular office hours except when on leave as authorized by the Kansas Court Personnel Rules.

This order shall be effective until June 18, 1981, at which time all official court reporters shall cease free-lance activity during regular office hours except as then may be permitted under the Kansas Court Personnel Rules.
