Administrative Order No. 30

Re: District Court Accounting Systems and Manual

The attached District Court Accounting Manual, incorporated as a part of this Administrative Order No. 30 and dated 7-81, is hereby adopted for the district courts effective this date.

Except as otherwise noted in the following paragraph, all district courts shall utilize the one-write accounting system, as set forth in the accounting manual, from and after January 1, 1982.

The district courts of Barton, Butler, Douglas, Harvey, Johnson, McPherson, Rice, Saline, Sedgwick, Shawnee, Sumner, and Wyandotte counties, which have or are implementing computer-based accounting systems approved by the Judicial Administrator, may forego implementation and utilization of the one-write accounting system. District courts utilizing the one-write accounting system may change to a computer-based accounting system after approval by the Judicial Administrator.

The Judicial Administrator is hereby directed to amend and supplement the District Court Accounting Manual as needed to keep the manual current with statutory law and state-of-the-art accounting practices. To aid the Judicial Administrator in this task, district courts are encouraged to forward to the Judicial Administrator suggestions for improvement in the manual and in district court accounting procedures.
