CODE OF JUDICIAL CONDUCT

CANON 4D

Canon 4D(5)(b) and (h) are hereby amended, effective January 1, 2002:

(b) a gift, award or benefit incident to the business, profession or other separate activity of a spouse or other family member of a judge residing in the judge's household, including gifts, awards and benefits for the use of both the spouse or other family member and the judge (as spouse or family member), provided the gift, award or benefit could not reasonably be perceived as intended to influence the judge in the performance of judicial duties <u>and is reported if its value exceeds \$150</u>;

....

(h) any other gift, bequest, favor or loan to the judge, the judge's spouse, dependent children, or dependent step children, only if: the donor is not a party or other person who has come or is likely to come or whose interests have come or are likely to come before the judge; and, if its value exceeds \$150, the judge reports it in the same manner as the judge reports compensation in Section 4H a gift.
