PREFATORY RULE


The Prefatory Rule to the Rules Relating to Admission of Attorneys is hereby repealed, effective July 1, 2005.

~~The Rules Relating to the Admission of Attorneys to practice law in the State of Kansas, numbered 701 through 709 are hereby amended, supplemented and renumbered 701 through 710. Unless otherwise specifically provided, newly numbered rules 701 through 710 are adopted and effective as of the 1st day of September, 1987.~~

~~—The Kansas Board for Admission of Attorneys shall hereafter be named the "Kansas Board of Law Examiners". (In the interest of economy, the Board may continue to utilize all existing printed supplies and may carry out its duties under the designation of Kansas Board for Admission of Attorneys or Kansas Board of Law Examiners, or both, for such period of time as the Board deems advisable.) All existing members of the Kansas Board for Admission of Attorneys shall continue as members of the Kansas Board of Law Examiners for the remainder of their existing terms of appointment.~~

~~—Rule 703, providing for admission to the Bar of Kansas without written examination, is repealed in its entirety effective the 15th day of July, 1987, at 5:00 p.m. All applications for admission without written examination received in the office of the Clerk of the Appellate Courts prior to July 15, 1987, at 5:00 p.m. shall be accepted by the Clerk and processed by the Board pursuant to former Rule 703.~~
