Supreme Court Rule 801 is hereby amended, effective upon publication in the advance sheets:

RULE 801 CONTINUING LEGAL EDUCATION COMMISSION

- There is hereby created <u>authorized</u> the Continuing Legal Education Commission. The Commission shall administer these rules subject to the supervision of the Supreme Court. The authority of the Commission shall include but not be limited to: (1) accrediting sponsors and programs and determining the number of hours of credit to be given for participation; (2) granting or withdrawing approval of all or less than all courses of a sponsor; (3) receiving and considering reports of attorneys; (4) granting waivers and extensions to complete requirements; (5) giving all notices and certifications required by this rule; and (6) adopting rules necessary to implement or administer the Supreme Court rules relating to continuing legal education.
- (b) The Commission shall consist of seven nine members, appointed by the Supreme Court, who are registered under Supreme Court Rule 208. The members shall include:

The Commission shall consist of seven nine members, appointed by the Supreme Court, All attorney members shall be who are registered under Supreme Court Rule 208. The members shall include:

- (1) four <u>five</u> practicing attorneys, <u>at least one of which shall be admitted to the Kansas Bar for fewer than 10 years;</u>
- (2) a representative from each of the University of Kansas and Washburn University Schools of Law:
- (3) one non-attorney member,
- 4) and a Justice or Judge.

Of the members first appointed, two shall be appointed to a term of one year, two for two years, and three for three years. Thereafter, Aappointments shall be for three-year terms. Any vacancy occurring on the Commission shall be filled by the Supreme Court. A Commission member appointed to fill a vacancy shall be appointed to serve the unexpired term of the previous member. No member shall serve more than two consecutive three-year terms, except that any person initially appointed for less than three years may serve two consecutive three-year terms thereafter.

- (c) The Commission shall meet at such times and places as it determines.
- (d) At the first meeting held in each annual attorney registration period a chairman, a vice chairman and a secretary shall be elected from the membership of the Commission. Four Five members shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business.
